Italian company appoints Ninety Nine as distributor in key markets and supplies Heysea

taly's CMC Marine, a leading producer of electric stabilisers for superyachts, has appointed Ninety Nine to handle distribution in both its home market in Taiwan as well as in mainland China. Ninety Nine has worked in the marine and yachting sector for over four decades.

While in Taiwan, CMC Marine also organised a series of events and meetings at Pier 22 Marina in Kaohsiung, presenting its latest-generation products to over 30 managers from the main shipyards in the area including Ocean Alexander, Horizon, Kha Shing and Johnson.

During extensive travels in Greater China, the Pisa-based company also signed a major contract with Heysea to supply Stabilis Electra HS120 for the Chinese builder's 142ft flagship, planned for delivery in 2020.

At this year's Cannes Yachting Festival, the company debuted Waveless by CMC Marine (pictured above), a new family of compact electric stabilisers designed for 12m-plus boats. The family comprises four models of STAB stabilisers and four TRIM intruders. The smallest model, STAB 25, is 22cm high and 38cm in diameter.
